In 2014, theoretical physicist Alan Lightman wrote a book called "The Accidental Universe: The World You Thought You Knew." This is a great book about science for non-scientists that talks about many issues that Unity folks have found interesting over the years, many of which we regularly discuss during our Frontiers of Consciousness class on fourth Mondays.

Chapter 3 is titled "The Spiritual Universe" where the author talks about the perennial question of the proper relationship between science and religion. At one point he presents a definition of God that he believes would agree with "almost all religions."

In order to come up with such a definition, he starts by identifying God is a being or entity. He goes on to say that this being is not restricted by the laws that govern matter and energy in the physical universe, a being outside matter and energy acting with purpose and will and sometimes violating existing physical laws by performing miracles. This being also has qualities such as intelligence, compassion and omniscience.

Note that he is not saying that he agrees with this definition, only that this is a definition that would be palatable to "almost all religions." This definition is commonly referred to as a theistic concept of god, one that is not supported by some of the most basic ideas in Unity.

Emilie Cady, Charles Fillmore and others consistently refer to god not as a being or an entity that possesses intelligence and omniscience but as the qualities in themselves. They refer to god as principle or intelligence itself, the sum total of the laws and principles that govern matter and energy. Still a bit vague but better than some disembodied entity or being.

This principle or intelligence is knowable in the sense that human beings can discern and understand it up to a point. In addition, this intelligence must necessarily operate the same way and be true at every time and place in the universe. These are also the central doctrines of science according to the Accidental Universe which tells me that Unity has much more in common with science than we do theistic religion.

Nonetheless, you will still hear theistic language in Unity. Male and female pronouns are used in reference to god. The title mother/father is no better. We can't help it, we are still evolving beyond a theistic understanding and the best we can do is to be aware of the limitations of our language and make the changes gently and gradually.

Science will eventually be able to explain how consciousness works based on the laws of physics and chemistry. Science excels at answering questions but there are some questions that science will never be able to answer such as why art in all of its forms can be moving and inspiring, how to find meaning in our lives and the most beneficial way to co-exist with our fellow life forms on planet earth and perhaps beyond. These are the questions that spirituality is best suited to address.

And even if science can establish a physical basis for consciousness, it still won't be able to tell us how to best use this unique quality or process or whatever it is and how to direct its very real power in our lives. Those are questions without a single certain answer that fall within the broad realm of spirituality, philosophy, ethics and aesthetics.

Starting at the end of May and continuing in June, we are going to be engaging questions like these during our Sunday services. Don't come expecting dogmatic answers but get ready to explore the wondrous possibilities!



Mother's Day Meditation

Happy Mother's Day to all biological mothers, adoptive mothers, mother figures and mothers of our 2 and 4 legged animals. Today we celebrate the qualities of Mothers and of women: intuition, compassion, love and nurturing. Charles Fillmore described Divine Motherhood as the *nourishing element of Divine Mind, in which spiritual ideals are brought to fruition by those who have expressed their loving, nurturing side of their soul to those around them*! So he was saying that these qualities are not just in women but in all of us. But today we will focus on the feminine use of these sides.
