Ministers' Message

The 4th of July has always been one of my favorite holidays, mostly because there are no holier-than-thou types telling us what we are doing right and wrong as we celebrate the day. There are always gadflies complaining that Christmas is too commercial, Thanksgiving is not thankful enough and Memorial Day is not solemn enough. But on July 4th we get to do as we please; celebrate in the way that seems most appropriate. In other words, freedom.

But for those who wish to ponder the philosophical and symbolic significance of the day, the best thing to do is to read the Declaration of Independence (even though it was actually passed on July 2, 1776, when the final wording was approved). In addition to being a declaration of independence from Britain, it was also a declaration of human rights as demonstrated by these words:

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

So how, when it comes to living up to the high aspirations set forth above, are we doing in 2018? Many good arguments can be made that, when the founders originally said "all men are created equal," there were numerous exceptions and qualification lurking beneath the literal meaning of those words.

The language intentionally excluded women and the word "men" was understood to be tacitly qualified with the word "white." Equality has been a long struggle for people both here and around the world.

Fortunately, we have made progress and the rights of women, people of color and gay people are gradually being advanced. The challenge we face is in avoiding these twin pitfalls: declaring "mission accomplished" (all is well) or insisting that things are as bad

or worse than ever (ignoring the real progress thus far).

There is ample evidence for the continued existence of injustice and inequality in this country. Statistics show that a fifth of the American population still believes that women should return to traditional roles, a tenth is opposed to interracial dating and there are more than three thousand hate crimes per year. We have made real progress and there is still work to be done.

This is especially important to remember in light of a tipping point that is approaching. Based on recent census population projections, white people will be a minority in America by 2045. According to the Brookings Institution: "New census population projections confirm the importance of racial minorities as the primary demographic engine of the nation's future growth, countering an aging, slowgrowing and soon to be declining white population."

How will today's majority be remembered when they have moved into minority status? What, bearing in mind that self-evident truth of universal equality contained in our founding document, will be their legacy? What examples of moral and ethical behavior will be passed on to the new majority? Are we setting a good example? Just some thoughts for consideration during our grand national celebration of freedom and equality.

Message from our Board of Directors

Have the new tax laws affected how you are setting your financial priorities and your choices as to how you will continue to support Unity of Auburn? We understand some of you may no longer have a tax advantage for charitable contributions.

Unity of Auburn keeps doors open and lights on with the Love Offerings of its congregation. Your Love Offerings are 62% of the 2018 budgeted income. This might be the right time to evaluate what Unity of Auburn means to you and how much it means in your life—how it fills your spiritual community needs and so much more.



Without the consistent financial support of the congregation, your Board of Directors will need to be proactive in its financial considerations and may need to make hard choices around what our future will look like. Unity of Auburn has no reserves to get us through the tough spots. Our thermometer is true to our current needs. \$8,900 a month is the Love Offering goal we must meet to maintain financial health. We are 5 months into 2018 and we've missed our goal to date by \$7,400. In May our Love Offerings were a total of \$6,000. Do the math. By the end of the year we are looking at an \$18,000 deficit.

Our costs have been modified many times. The next cuts would guarantee Unity of Auburn could no longer meet its mission. We are on a constant search for additional income sources. We have maximized the income sources we have.

There is no magic here. We have no benefactors. It is in your hands. Please understand: To keep Unity of Auburn flourishing, your financial support is not an option. **IT IS A MUST**.
