This will no doubt be a very different July 4th celebration for most Americans. The thing that I have always enjoyed the most about the holiday is its free form nature. No rigid requirements for what one ought to be doing, watching, listening to or eating which is certainly an excellent way to approach a day where independence and freedom are the primary themes.

This year reality is requiring us to deal with some reasonable restraints on what we regard to be freedom and for the most part, Americans are responding positively to the call asking us to put the greater good of everyone above our own personal desire to do as we please at all times. Yes, I've seen the cell phone videos of the face mask fighters spitting and coughing on store employees for asking them to wear a mask but from what I see, they are a small percentage of the population like most extremists are.

Freedom and responsibility go hand in hand. One of the more challenging aspects of the Unity Movement for newcomers is the emphasis on personal responsibility. The cause of most suffering in the world starts with individual consciousness, not some supernatural evil entity.

Everybody wants freedom and power but responsibility? Not so much. That's where the sense of discomfort starts to rise up. Responsibility is regarded as a burden rather than something empowering. Unity focuses on a very specific type of personal responsibility, taking control of the content of our mind. In one of the old publications that used to be on the Unity Headquarters web page I found this statement:

"Unity emphasizes the creative power of thought in our life experience. We refer to this as the 'Law of Mind Action'. When we take personal responsibility to choose life-affirming thoughts, words and actions, we experience a more fulfilling and abundant life."

It's not always comfortable but it is empowering. In contrast to what I learned in Unity, traditional Christian religion told me that we're not really responsible for our lot in life because we're in bondage to sin, we're slaves of satan. That might be a good name for a heavy metal band but it's a really dysfunctional world view.

Our thoughts do not create reality itself, they create our *experience* of reality so we want to guide our thought process to create the best experience we can imagine. Unity cofounder Charles Fillmore explains it this way: "It is the law of Spirit that we must *be* that which we would draw to us. If we would draw to us love, we must be love, be loving and kind; if we would have peace and harmony in our environment, we must establish it within ourselves."

The law of mind action is not about manipulating reality. We attract ourselves to people, situations and things through the beliefs, attitudes and thoughts we hold, both conscious and unconscious. It's not about controlling anything out there; it's about getting ourselves in alignment with the creative principles at work in the universe so those principles can work through us for the greater good of all. This is Unity's vision of positive and creative freedom.


