Unity's Prayer theme this year, "No matter the circumstances, all is well with my soul," recalled a talk I heard by Rev. Robert Brumet, in which he compared our actions in life to a theatrical performance — asserting that we are both actors and screenwriters in our own play, with power to influence the outcomes in our life.

At times when I may not feel that "all is well" in my life's story, the perspective that my life is in some way like a play can help me adopt a more objective view.

Some plays, I know, are tragedies. Some circumstances in life, too, seem tragic. And yet, when I see a play, no matter how tragic the ending, I can remind myself that it is only a play. After it is done, the actors will go home happy. Though the characters they portrayed may have met tragic ends, their "real selves" will remain well.

Just so, I like to think there is some part of me that persists beyond this physical self I inhabit – beyond this skin that I wear, beyond the things that happen to me – much like how actors, in their true identities, continue to exist beyond their roles, beyond the plays in which they have performed.

In this view, there is some part of me in which all is well, and all shall be well – always – even when conditions around me (or in my feelings, my mind, or my physical, material, mortal body) seem to be falling apart. There is that part of me (called by some the soul) which cannot be destroyed or made unwell – no matter the circumstances.

In the end, the situations in my life are fleeting, transient, and temporary. Beyond those physical circumstances exists a reality in which all things are and will be well with me. Robert Brumet commented that, like an actor in a play, "When we are exclusively identified with (our personality), then we begin to lose sight of our true origin ... the Divine, if you will." Then, we may feel that we are defined by our environment, rather than "Our Self, the Christ within."

Instead, he suggests, we are not merely like a character in a play who is subject to the circumstances of the script. Rather, we are also the scriptwriter. We are the author of our own life – as if our future self has written an autobiography about how we awakened to the Divine Self, and we are presently acting out the story of that transformation.

"In every experience," Brumet said, "I am a character in this grand story ... and at the same time I am the author of it.... We are both in the world and not of the world. We live a life that we have been given — as personalities. We did not choose it; we just showed up and did the best we could to survive in it. And yet, as Divine Beings, we know that this life is meticulously scripted to awaken us to the Truth that is within us."

If I can remember the wisdom in these words, at times when I am not feeling that all is well, it can help me to believe that – regardless of what twists and turns my story may take – there will come a time when I see that my story – all our stories – will have a happy ending.

Someday, we will go home from this production in which we have been acting, and realize the magnificent, integral part we have played – in a story unimaginably grand.




FYI...

Status of the Matching Grant to Upgrade our AV Equipment!

A generous donor has agreed to provide a matching grant on a dollar-for-dollar basis of up to \$5,000 for the purpose of upgrading our audio-visual equipment. To date we have collected \$3,018 towards this effort. As we move into the new reality of streaming services, Zoom and improving our on-line presence it has become critical for us to upgrade our cameras, computer and sound system and to hire someone who knows how the run them.
