We are honoring our dads this month, but we are also looking at a bigger idea of the fathering aspect of life that helps us know who we are, and that we belong. Webster defines father as "male parent" but also as "an originator or source." As a verb it is "to provide for, or care for. To father means to look after, to protect.

More than any other story in the gospel, the parable of the prodigal son illustrates a father's compassion. You will recall it is the story of a young man who left this father's home, went out and had a grand time, fell flat on his face, hungry, then came back home, hoping his dad would take him back. When his father saw him approaching from a great distance, he rushed to meet him, embraced him. It is one of the most vivid and passionate spiritual images. When we turn to God, God rushes to meet us.

Some art historians call Rembrandt's oil painting, Return of the Prodigal Son, the greatest picture ever painted. It illustrates pure love. The father holding his son. The son resting against his father's breast. The story isn't really about human love of an earthly father. It is the story of divine love and its power to transform us. It is about homecoming, knowing that we are not alone.

A few weeks ago, I heard my 10-year-old nephew say to his 14-year-old sister, who was crying, "You don't have to cry. You don't have to do anything to be loved." I invite you to re-read that line. "You don't have to do anything to be loved." Jesus reminded us, "Know ye not that ye are all children of the most high?"

Are you feeling estranged from your father? The love of the Divine can bring you back home. Unclench your fists, open your arms. Look for what you love in common with another. There were times when I felt disconnected from my dad. Whenever I felt that way, I would sit in his favorite chair or pick up one of the hammers or wrenches he worked with for many years. I could feel his hands on it. I could feel the love and devotion he worked with to provide for our family.

What do you love in common with your father, or a father figure? Find it and then throw yourself completely into the fire of the relationship. Honor the life-generating protective essence that is present in our fathers. Give thanks for the goodness, the intelligence, and the love that inspires us to rise up again and again. Thank you to all dad's everywhere!

"Our thoughts are prayers, and we are always praying...."

"Our thoughts are prayers; take charge of what you're saying."
As Lucille Olson's song suggests, our minds are always "listening in" on our words and thoughts – and possibly obeying those words as commands, without our realizing it. So, it's good to watch one's language!

For instance, I sometimes catch myself using the words "I am" casually to describe conditions I wouldn't really want to associate with myself on a habitual basis. When I want to describe a condition that I hope is temporary, I try to change it to past tense, or change the words – so that it doesn't sound as if the condition is a part of me.

For instance, if I've been ill, I'll say, "I'm healing from a cold I had." Or if feeling tired: "I'm going to rest to build up my energy."

It helps if you put a little affirmative song in your head each day, which will play on "repeat" for you all day long. ("Every little cell in my body is happy!")

It takes vigilance and practice, but we can use our words to "trick" our minds (and by extension, our bodies) into doing and being more of what we want, if we take care to do so.

Once we get our minds into the habit of positive affirmation, we can influence our perceptions so that we see ourselves, and the world around us, in a brighter light. And when that happens, a shift can occur in what had seemed to be our physical reality, as well.

Though all that we experience depends on our perception, our perception is within our power to influence – and, gradually, to change.

So, "keep a higher consciousness, a state of peacefulness – and know that God is always there. And every thought becomes a prayer."

A Wonderful Prayer-Poem for Life

When I was a very young boy, my guess I was four or five at the time, my parents taught me the beloved prayer and poem, The Prayer of Faith. I fondly remember dad or mom coming into my brother's and my bedroom (at our bedtime) and listening to us say our prayers. I remember that first prayer to be, 'The "God is my help in every need, prayer." My brother, who was six years older than I, was frequently, 'and not so quietly, snickering,' while I was seriously trying to recite the prayer correctly for my patiently awaiting parents.

Alas, I didn't know it at the time, but THAT prayer would follow me all the days of my life...not because I memorized the prayer, but because 'its words seemed to capture every aspect, every subject, every element, every new encounter of my young, burgeoning life.

And it figures that It became more than just 'a lovely prayer 'To God,' but later a means for my having 'a personal relationship, an intimate conversation, a daily interaction with the "Christ the Truth, that is in me."

Whether it was my high school or college education, "I now am wise, I now am true, patient and kind, and loving, too," the Prayer of Faith made perfect sense' and seemed to apply to each new lesson, encounter I made growing up (both in my truth and formal education). All things I am, can do, and be..." served me well in making difficult decisions in 'the best of times and in the occasional 'not so best of times ("God is my health, I can't be sick; God is my strength, unfailing, quick:" Such simple, beautiful, powerful (pragmatic) words to live by.

And interesting to note, I most recently found out that The Prayer of Faith is the most often used prayer in Unity...and that it was a favorite of Myrtle Fillmore. In fact, the first time this prayer appeared in a Unity publication was in the August 1898 issue of WEE WISDOM, the Unity monthly magazine for children, in an article titled, "The Truth Child's Rosary" - with a byline, 'Aunt Myrtle,' and credit for the prayer is given to Hannah More Kohaus.

Hannah More Kohaus is believed to have attended the Higher Thought Center in England, going on to lead the Science of Being Center, which became the Church of New Thought in 1904.

Later, the poem was included in Unity Song Selections, the 1941 Unity hymnal. It remains popular today, perhaps the most recited (and beloved) prayer by Unity congregations and members after only James Dillet Freeman's "Prayer for Protection."
