Freedom for You

I am not bound by any person or circumstance. I am free with the freedom of Spirit.

Our July fourth holiday celebrates freedom. Rev. Dorothy Pierson once said to me, "Cherie, you will never be free from any experience until you are first free in that experience."

Have you ever been bullied, betrayed, treated unjustly or been the brunt of someone's anger, addiction, or ignorance? Have you ever made a mistake or hurt someone? When we refuse to forgive, we bind ourselves to people and events with chains stronger than steel. Yes, it's appropriate to acknowledge hurts. But no matter how justified we believe we are in feeling angry, we are not free. In holding a grievance, we are keeping ourselves in a cycle of pain that affects our health, happiness, and well-being.

To set ourselves free, some hurts need only some imaginary scissors to snip away the hurt. Maybe you live with someone who drops their clothes on floor. You like things in order. As you pick things up, you think, "I work too. I don't expect to come home and be a maid." Irritation builds as you slam-dunk the dirty socks into the laundry basket secretly imagining you'll dye your mates underwear bright red. With some prayer and forgiveness, snipping scissors can usually cut you free from these negative feelings.

A more serious concern may take bolt cutters. Maybe a parent criticized you for your entire life. An effective remedy is to use imaginary bolt cutters to tame your self-talk and stop the story. Don't sever the relationship but sever the way you hold it in your mind and heart. Give up the self of you that has been abused, was betrayed, was once unpopular, grew up poor, was rejected, messed up, used to be thin, was wrongly accused, did not get the love.

Living life through the lens of what's wrong strips you of peace and joy. And while your grief can seem justified, ultimately it costs too much. No grievance is worth the pain you must carry to keep it alive.

As you grow toward God, you come to know there is a Spirit in you that remains whole and intact no matter what circumstances you walk through. Your core essence is untouched by any hurt or harm. This July fourth step into the freedom of forgiveness!
